- A 'how to do it' **activities** and **examples** will help you learn through knowledge application and encourage you to reflect on your learning.
- Compass Guide feedback templates, Ask Your Supervisor sections and suggested reading will give you tools, ideas and confidence for finding your own way through the postgraduate research adventure knowing what to look for and which questions to ask.

It is important to note that **this guide is <u>not</u> a research methodology textbook**. Research methods differ across scientific disciplines and even within disciplines based on specific research questions.

Instead, this guide provides a compass to help students navigate their postgraduate research journey – irrespective of their research discipline and/or chosen research topic.

Although this guide is a resourceful friend, it should not be used as a replacement for a postgraduate supervisor. Your supervisor will be the most valuable resource during your postgraduate studies. Using this guide will help you be/become an excellent research student, build and maintain effective relationship with your supervisor(s), and successfully complete your postgraduate degree.

Every postgraduate research journey is unique, and you are (or will be) creating and living your own journey. Like many things in life, the more you invest yourself into your postgraduate research experience, the more you will get out of it.
